

WHAT ARE MESSENGERS?

Messengers are delegates from your church that are entrusted with voting privileges at the CBGC Annual Meeting. Messengers play a vital role in our Network because they give your church a voice in the business decisions of the CBGC as defined by our Constitution and By-Laws.

WHAT CHURCHES ARE ALLOWED TO SEND MESSENGERS?

HOW MANY MESSENGERS ARE ALLOTTED TO MY CHURCH?

The number of Messengers that your church is allotted is based on your current church membership as defined by the CBGC Constitution and By-Laws. Here is the current scale.

1-50 members	= 2 Messengers	251-300 members	= 7 Messengers
51-100 members	= 3 Messengers	301-350 members	= 8 Messengers
101-150 members	= 4 Messengers	351-400 members	= 9 Messengers
151-200 members	= 5 Messengers	401+ members	= 10 Messengers
201-250 members	= 6 Messengers		

HOW ARE MESSENGERS SELECTED?

Your church is responsible for developing its process for Messenger selection.

WHEN DO I GET MY MESSENGER CARD?

When the Senior Pastor checks in at the registration table at the beginning of the Annual Meeting, he will receive enough Messenger Cards for the church's allotted number of Messengers. The Senior Pastor is then responsible for giving the Messenger Cards to the appropriate church members. Lost Messenger Cards cannot be replaced.

HOW AND WHEN DO MESSENGERS VOTE?

When votes are called for during Business Sessions, Messengers will hold up their Messenger Cards to express their desired decision.
